Happy Christmas. Yes, it is still Christmas unless you happen to be reading this after 29th January....

After the great celebration of Jesus birth we move on.

On 6th January (or Sunday 8th) we remember the visit of the wise men to Jesus. They were not inhabitants of Israel; they were visitors from another country who followed a star because they recognised that it was special and told them of a special birth. They left their homes, travelled a long way trusting that they would find the one whose birth the star announced. They were determined to find the child and, when they did, they gave him costly gifts. The wise men remind us that Jesus came for everyone, and that God calls each one of us in a way that is appropriate for us as individuals as the appearance of a star was to wise men who studied the night sky.

On 2nd February (or Sunday 29th January) we celebrate Candlemas. This marks the time when Mary and Joseph took Jesus into the Temple to offer thanks for him. There they met Simeon and Anna, faithful servants in the Temple who waited for the coming of the one promised to save Israel. They recognised and gave thanks for the child. Their faithfulness and patience are a model to us as we welcome Jesus afresh into our lives.

- For all who lead us in our churches, that they may have the support which they need to guide us to make our churches a place of welcome.
- For all who live in the areas of conflict in the world that they may find the way to peace. We especially remember the people of Ukraine.
- For our government as they respond to the severe challenges which face our country.

- For our health and social services that they may get the resources they need to do their work as they would wish to.
